Re: Change in Academic Location of the Minor in Medical Humanities

The College of Arts & Sciences requests consideration for an academic location change for the Minor in Medical Humanities (605), effective fall 2019. Currently the minor resides in the Honors College. However, after consideration by the Honors College and by the College of Arts and Sciences (CAS), we are requesting that CAS take over the academic oversight and assessment of this minor.

This decision was based on a number of factors, most notably that the breadth of courses in the minor makes it better suited to be housed in CAS as one of its interdisciplinary minors. Further, the Honors College does not feel at this time that it is an appropriate home for academic programs other than those targeting students of university and departmental honors. The minor is presently the only “non-honors” program housed in the Honors College and, as such, is out of place. Note that this request does not involve any changes to the curriculum and the same faculty member, Dr. Ted Zerucha, Department of Biology and Academic Mentor in the Honors College, would continue coordinating the curriculum and handling assessment.
